## Workshop 1 - Community Development

### Speakers

**Robyn Robertson** (Workshop Leader)

**Ms. Ooi Kiah Hui** serves among the poor and marginalised communities both in the rural and urban areas, including the urban squatters, Orang Asli and refugees. She is serving with Malaysian Care, and their organisational experiences focus on using community development approaches to empower the community and address socio-economic issues. Her academic training is in the field of Social Development and Sustainable Livelihoods. She is married to Yeap Chin Aik.

**Ms. Irma L. Cosino** is the Chief Operating Officer of ASKI Global Ltd (Singapore). She has been in the microfinance industry in various capacities for almost fifteen years, was Managing Director of ABS-CBN Bayan Academy for Social Entrepreneurship & Human Resource Development until March 2010.

She also served as Consultant to several international banks and holds three Master Degrees in the fields of Development Communication, Public Administration and Entrepreneurship from the Philippines and the United States. Irma and ASKI Global Ltd works with Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) and other migrant communities to introduce Financial Literacy and Basic Entrepreneurship so that they can multiply their income and be reunited with their families.

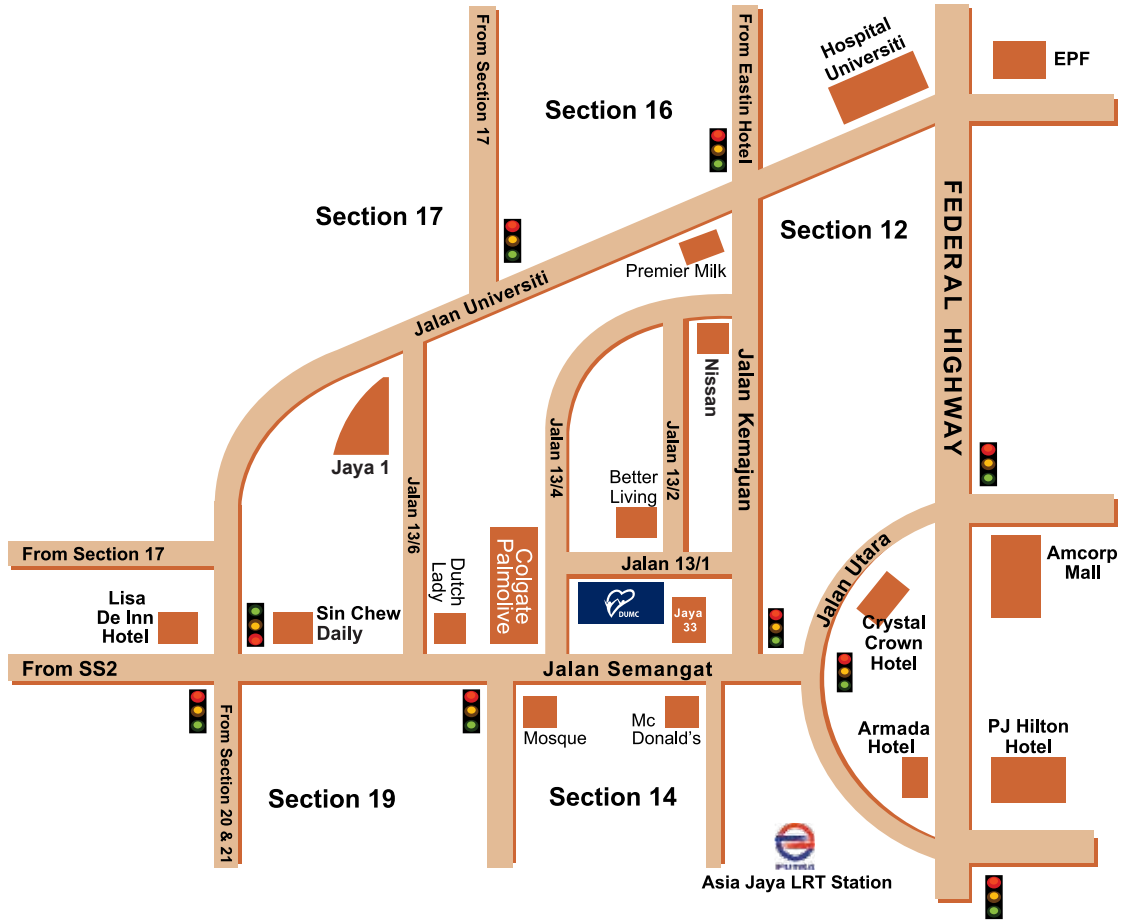
## Workshop 2 - Advocacy

### Speakers

**Andrew Khoo Chin Hock** (Workshop Leader) graduated LLB (Hons) from King's College London (1988) and has practiced as an Advocate and Solicitor of High Court of Malaya for 17 ½ years. For the last 2¾ years he has been Chairperson of Human Rights Committee of Bar Council Malaysia. Andrew compiled and edited Bar Council Malaysia's (BCM) human rights review submitted to the UN Human Rights Council (HRC) for the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) process in September 2008, and represented BCM at the HRC's open sessions in February and June 2009. He produced the document "Developing A Comprehensive Policy Framework for Refugees AND Asylum-Seekers In Malaysia" in collaboration with UNHCR and with civil society organisations.

**Kon Onn Sein** trained in law, a barrister admitted to the Bar in England. Admitted to the Malaysian bar and holds a MA in Social Development from the University of Sussex under a Chevening scholarship. Since 1990, Kon has been in legal practice and has been a partner of a legal firm in Muar, Johor. In 2000, Mr. Kon assumed the position of managing director of the Foundation for Community Studies and Development, which works in poverty alleviation and community development programmes for the poor and needy, in particular the Orang Asli and the urban poor.

Mr. Kon has run various training programmes at grass root level as well as at NGO forums including presenting a paper at the International Conference of Social Workers. He was leading a team of Orang Asli graduates to present a proposal for the National Economic Consultative Council in policies to upgrade the standards of living for the Orang Asli. He has also sat in a number of working committees for SUHAKAM in Orang Asli development.
